SUMMER CERTIFICATE COURSE ON NATIONAL SECURITY

The nature of security challenges is rapidly transforming. Globalisation and disruptive new technologies are changing the way we live, work, and think and thereby inducing, in the process, a profound change in our lives both private and national. The conventional national security concept developed in the seventeenth century may not serve the modern aspirational interests of a large country like India -with its multiple diversity and huge demography and situated, as it is, close to one of the most violence and conflict prone geographies of the world. Need to re-imagine (or to re-design) is clearly required to enable India to achieve global prominence. India has to negotiate the complexities and the challenges with its embedded multi-dimensional perspective unlike any other nation state.

Emerging challenges to national security are increasingly networked with the cultural sensitivities. These are transnational and national in character, superimposed by transactional interdependence between nation states. Amorphous threats connected to a political geography emanating from religiously motivated groups or even organised crime syndicates dealing with all varieties of illicit trades can and do inflict damages to nation states. Some of these threats do emerge 'regional' and 'hybrid' threats and perpetrators work in tandem with parties in conflict. Deployment of military internally against such threats has limitations. Building capacities of several agencies jointly and harnessing civilian capacities to deal with the challenge in the hinterland will be necessary.

Borders do play a role in conflict between nations but now increasingly the issues relating to economy and trade, climate change issues, critical resource extraction claim attention as tools of pressure along with exploitation /manipulation of socio-political fault lines. Events of the last few decades show internal uprisings bringing collapse of the nations in several countries, changes in regime etc. on their own or aided and abetted by external elements.

There is a need to reorient India's strategic view to factor in the newly emerging trends and challenges and reimagine its security preparedness. PPF's Summer Certificate Course will cover all these aspects for a compressive understanding of national security, especially in the Indian context.
